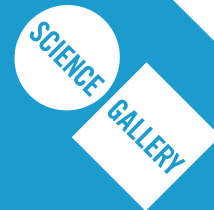
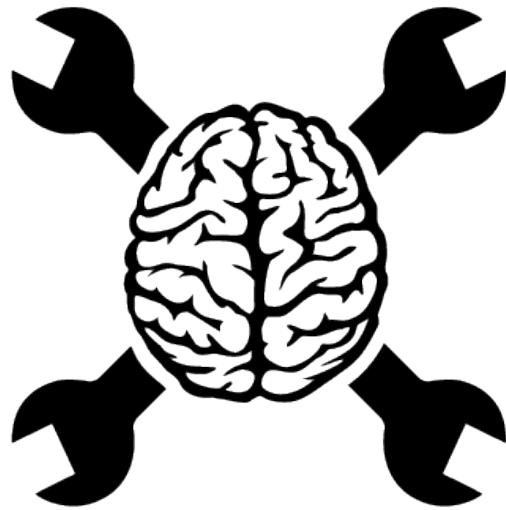

## **Introduction**

After thorough deliberation with the consortium members, we have concluded that the defined length of the videos does not fit the dissemination related purpose related to this deliverable. A 10-minute video length would be too demanding for the attention span of the targeted audience when it comes to such online material. We therefore decided not to focus on a fixed length of 10 minutes for that does not align with the preference of the audience that we strive to reach.

Furthermore, video making and editing is for a large part an activity which we will to outsource to other parties, we also concluded that the decision of having to create 10, 10-minute videos would lead to overspending of the available budget. This was evident after having done some inquiry with parties that offer video making services.

Because of the arguments mentioned above we decided that it would fit the project to create videos that efficiently communicate a clear message (quality) instead of just focussing of a certain length of video (quantity).

Besides these edited short videos, we still have all of the raw video files available for possible future editing.

In the first stages of making video material public, we decided that only people with the proper link can access the video material on Vimeo. All this movie material will then be gradually uploaded to our central webpage and social media channels. By doing so we continue to offer novel material online, thus keeping our social media channels relevant for visitors. This way we hope to nurture a community around the projects.

After all video material has “premiered” through our social media channels, the different videos will be made more widely available on our project specific Vimeo channel by changing the privacy settings to a less exclusive type. The videos are also shared through social media channels of consortium members.
